You may have to pay a tax charge, known as the ‘High Income Child Benefit Charge’, if you have an individual income over £50,000.</p>	<p>£20.70 per week for your eldest child and £13.70 for each additional child. <p>Nursery grant (30 hours of free childcare⁷)</p> <p>⁷If you don’t qualify you’ll get 15 hours of free childcare.</p>	<p>Child must be three or four. You (and your partner if you have one) must be in work. Each parent must earn £125.28 per week if aged 25+ and £118.08 per week if aged 21-24 eg the equivalent of 16 hours a week at National Minimum Wage. More info at www.gov.uk/help-with-child-care-costs</p>	<p>All students not in receipt of the Childcare Grant.</p>

Types of income	Help available*	Who can benefit*
Nursery grant (15 hours of free childcare)	All three and four year olds are entitled to a free, part-time early learning place (for 15 hours per week, 38 weeks per year). Registered nurseries will claim this grant automatically for you from the Local Authority. It is paid directly to the nursery on a termly basis. If you are claiming the Childcare Grant you should deduct the nursery grant from your total claim. School costs	All school children in reception year 1 and year 2 are now entitled to free school meals: www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals You may be able to get free school meals after year 2 if you are in receipt of certain benefits. Some local councils also provide help with school clothing, including PE kit. You will usually need to fill in an application form. Contact your council. Part-time work	If you would like to find some work you can sign up to the University's Job Shop. There are also volunteering opportunities, such as working as a member of the Student Welcome team. This may fit in better with your family commitments and it will also be a useful addition to your CV. Sure Start Maternity Grant	£500 grant to help with the extra costs of your first baby (or, if you have children already, a multiple birth eg twins) for those on a low income. Claim at any time from the 29th week of pregnancy until your child is three months using form SF100 (Sure Start) www.gov.uk/sure-start-maternity-grant/how-to-claim	Full-time undergraduates Part-time undergraduates Postgraduates
Students with a disability	Both full-time and part-time students (who are studying at least 25% of an equivalent full-time course) may be able to apply to Student Finance England for the Disabled Students' Allowance. Student Finance England's Maintenance Loan is calculated to support you for term-time only with the expectation that you will supplement your income by working over the long summer vacation.

Lone parents who cannot work during the summer may be entitled to claim Income Support over the months of July and August. Claims should be submitted from the last week in June. Certain lone parents may be entitled to Income Support all year e.g. postgraduate students with zero income. For information about making a benefits claim, you can call 0800 055 6688.

For JSA/IS/ESA call 0345 608 8545. For Universal Credit call 0345 600 0723. Make sure you have your National Insurance number and bank details to hand.
