BA Extended Degree in Early Childhood Studies

This four-year extended degree provides the background necessary for degree-level study in Early Childhood Studies, and is aimed at those who do not have the required qualifications for entry at level 4.

BA Early Childhood Studies

The BA Early Childhood Studies is a three years vocational course designed for those working with young children to gain licence to practise once they have successfully completed the two years professional practice placement module. It can be taken as a full or part time degree and students may choose to either attend classes at the University in the day or evening or study by distance learning or in mixed mode.

Early Years Education (two year accelerated degree) BA (Hons)

Early Years Education is an accelerated degree programme to enable you to become a teacher who specialises in working with children aged three to seven years old. On successful completion of the course, you may progress to a postgraduate programme offering QTS or MA in Early Childhood Studies.

Funding

Students may either:

- check with their employer or Local Authority about the possibility of financial assistance with the costs of the course
- apply for the statutory student support for full or part-time students through Student Finance England – www.gov.uk/student-finance

MA Early Childhood Studies

This distance-learning programme is designed for professionals working within the early childhood workforce, including those who may not be working directly with children but are involved in developing the early childhood workforce, such as further education lecturers and local authority advisors.
